## Ages of children?



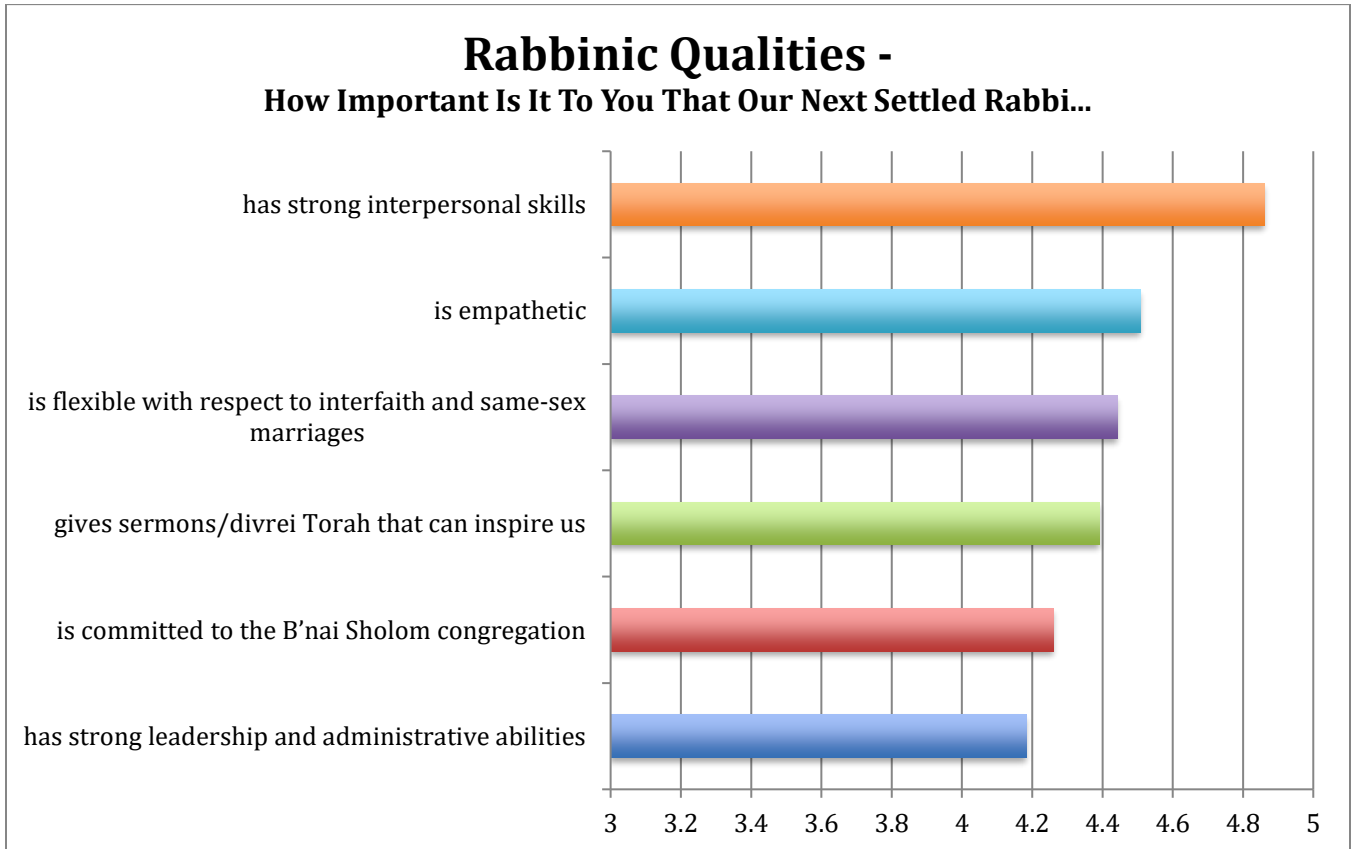

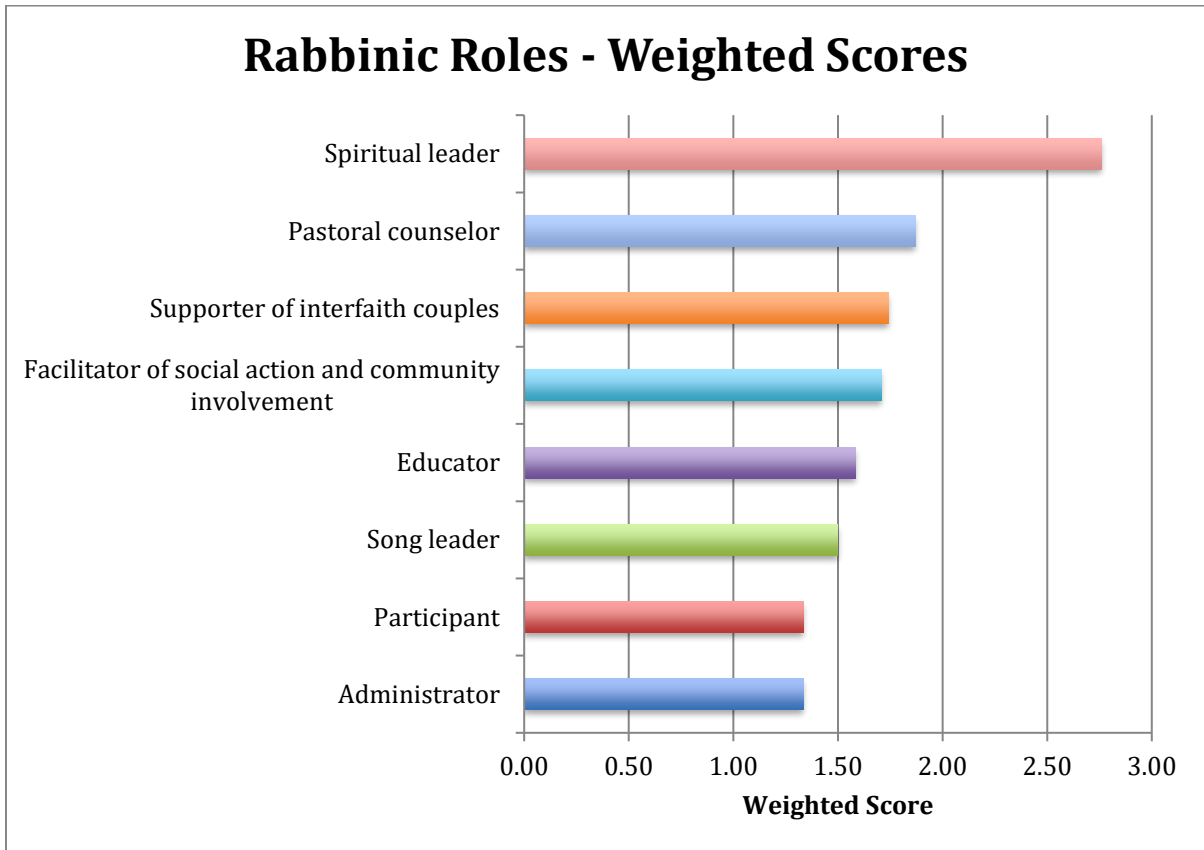

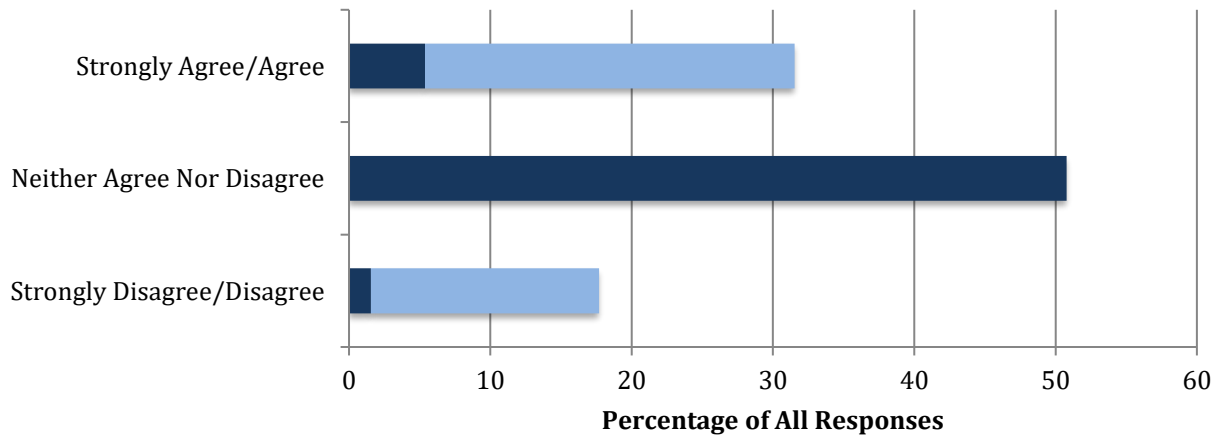
## It is important to me to have a full-time rabbi.
